About this Serious Game:

Whether you are a trainee or an attending, this Serious Game will help you learn (or brush up on!) how to navigate the rollercoaster that can be caring for the paediatric patient!

Tonsillectomy is one of the most common paediatric surgeries. Even non-specialized centres will perform this surgery. Thus, all anaesthesiologists may care for children with obstructive sleep apnoea undergoing tonsillectomy. Of course, this requires knowledge of managing a case of bleeding tonsils.

Learning objectives: Upon completion of this Serious Game, participants should be able to:

- Design paediatric airway emergency management strategies within the available setting;
- Debate optimal anaesthesia management of the unstable paediatric patient;
- Define the impact of enlarged tonsils on paediatric airway;
- Evaluate severity of Obstructive Sleep Apnoea (OSA) and the need for sleep study;
- Critique induction options for the child with post-tonsillectomy bleeding;
- Incorporate crisis resource management tools in decision making in unstable paediatric patient.
