Environmental sustainability is one of many priority areas for the Republic of North Macedonia, as a part of the country's national agenda. R. North Macedonia embarked on mainstreaming the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development into its National Sustainable Development Plan in December 2015, with the aim of developing an SDG Plan 2016-2030, based on an assessment of needs and potential, as well as setting targets relevant to the national context. A total of 18 UN agencies will work together under the new United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (SDCF) over the next five years to help the country achieve the Sustainable Development Goals: 17 interconnected and ambitious goals which address the major development challenges faced by people in North Macedonia and around the world. The Sustainable Development Goals are a global call to action to end poverty, protect the earth's environment and climate, and ensure that people everywhere can enjoy peace and prosperity.

- Inhaled general anesthesia:

- Limited use of Isofllurane and Desflurane.
- Seldom or Never N2O.
- **Regional techniques:**
 - Nerve blocks, epidural and spinal anesthesia.
 - Intraoperative and postoperative use.
 - Minimizing the use of other medications.
- Intravenous general anesthesia:
- It is being used as the preferable option instead of inhaled general anesthesia.
- Lower carbon footprint than any inhalational equivalent.
