*The committee works to promote the effectiveness of simulation training and show how it can be integrated into a national anaesthesiology curriculum.*

*Simulation is an interactive learning method where one can apply, learn and train knowledge and skills in specific situations. It also allows for training of non-technical competencies, such as communication, collaboration, leadership, situational awareness and decision-making. Of note, anaesthesiologists have been pioneers in the use of high-fidelity mannequins to study human factors and improve crisis resources management skills for critical situations.*
